What is it?

- “Goddard Safety Day/Safety Stand-Down”
- Objective - Safety Awareness, Education, Inspections & Assistance
- Center-Wide Event
 - One Directorate at a time
 - One to Five Days Duration
 - Directorate Specific Organizational Mission
 - Common Program Activities Center-Wide
 - Utilize Web-Site as Central Information Base (Safety 1st Web-site)



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
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Why Do It?

 - Real Safety Work Accomplished - No Play Day



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
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Leadership Involvement








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Lessons Learned

 - Brochures and Posters (Advertising and Information)
 - Variety of Subjects/Topics (Something for Everyone)
 - Workshops
 - Vendors (Products) Participation
 - Debrief by Division Chiefs in Directorate Closing Event
 - Use of Feed-Back Surveys






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Lessons Learned

• Things To Be Improved

- Advertising Events As Soon As possible
- Availability of All Presentations (Electronically) Before Events
- Assemble Team for Each Directorate to Support Directorate Campaign (Including Contractors)
- More Detailed Logistics Planning
 - Schedules
 - Facilities, “Signing” Person & Presentation Equipment
 - Weather Considerations
- More Focused Workshops (Specific Topics)
- More Center-Wide Workshops (Open to All)
- Compress Overall Campaign Schedule
- One Center-Wide Vendors Event
- Increase Cross Directorate Participation
- Capture Participation Data

- Planning Process needs to be Improved
- Follow On Actions Should be Executed
